

BIL Overview

- Bipartisan Infrastructure Law (BIL)
 - AKA Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (IIJA)
- National Infrastructure Investment = \$1.2 Trillion across 5 years
 - Nearly 400 programs across 12 Federal Agencies
 - 60% Formula / 40% Discretionary







4-Year Lifespan





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

Applicant Cost Share Expectation

- Eligible applicants are expected to contribute a portion of the non-Federal match requirement.
- This contribution can be in the form of cash and/or in-kind contributions.
- The goal is to demonstrate the applicant's commitment to the project.
- The contribution should be significant. For a local public entity, 5% of the non-federal match is a good guideline, but not a requirement.


Applicant Cost Share – Exclusions and Justifications

- Eligible applicants who cannot meet the cost share expectation can provide detailed written justifications.
- Exceptions or exclusions from the cost share expectations may be granted based on valid reasons.
- Collaborative applications or regional projects may also be considered for exclusion on a case-by-case basis.


Important notes

- The Hub is **not** selecting projects
- Projects only receive BKF funding <u>if awarded</u> a federal grant
 - Federal agencies make project selections and provide award notification
- This is additive only
 - Communities can apply without requesting Technical Assistance OR making a Build Kansas Fund Application







Build Kansas Funds Applications

Funding Opportunities

Federal-State Partnership for Intercity Passenger Rail Program

- Funding Agency: U.S. DOT Funded by BIL
- FY24 Due December 16, 2024
- Broad focus is to improve American passenger rail assets by funding projects that reduce maintenance backlogs, enhance performance, or expand intercity passenger rail service. Eligible projects may include privately operated intercity rail services if an eligible applicant is involved.
- 20% cost-match requirement
- Implementation: \$1,057,596,637
- Eligible Applicants:
 - States, public agencies, political subdivisions,







National Scenic Byways Program (NSBP)

- Funding Agency: U.S. DOT Funded by BIL
- FY 23/24 Due December 16, 2024
- To implement projects on designated scenic byways and develop scenic byway programs.
 Highway improvements, byway facilities, safety enhancements, recreation access, interpretive information, and tourist services are eligible.
- 20% cost-match requirement
- Implementation: \$26.95M
- Eligible Applicants:
 - State DOTs, Tribal govt., others partner with DOT or Tribal govt.

Clean School Bus (CSB) Rebates Program

- Funding Agency: U.S. DOT Funded by BIL
- FY24 Due January 9, 2025
- Supports subsidizing the replacement of existing school buses with zero-emission (ZE) or clean buses. Aims to improve air quality on the buses, in bus loading areas, and in surrounding communities. Funding supports the purchase of cleaner buses, eligible infrastructure, and workforce training.
- No cost-match requirement
- Implementation: \$965M
- Eligible Applicants: States, cities, counties, public school districts, Tribal govt., nonprofits, for-profits







Regional Infrastructure Accelerator (RIA) Program

- Funding Agency: U.S. DOT Funded by the FAST Act
- FY24 Due January 9, 2025
- Establishes RIAs to assist entities in increasing their capacity to deliver Transportation Infrastructure Finance and Innovation Act (TIFIA)-eligible projects through innovative financing strategies. Projects will support safety, equity, climate sustainability, and workforce development.
- No cost-match requirement
- Implementation: \$10M
 - \$975,000 (Min) / \$2M (Max)
- Eligible Applicants: States, Cities, Counties, Tribal govts., MPOs, RTPOs, Multistate groups, Regional transportation commissions

Rebuilding American Infrastructure with Sustainability and Equity (RAISE)

- Funding Agency: U.S. DOT Funded by BIL
- FY25 Due January 30, 2025
- Broad focus on surface transportation infrastructure projects to improve safety, sustainability, and connectivity; planning and design component.
- 20% cost-match requirement
- Implementation: \$1.5B, \$25M max award
- Eligible Applicants:
 - States, Local govts., MPOs, Tribal govt., Transit agencies







<u>Promoting Resilient Operations for Transformative, Efficient, and Cost-Saving Transportation (PROTECT) Program (Part A): Planning Grants</u>

- Funding Agency: U.S. DOT Funded by BIL
- FY24-26 Due February 24, 2025
- Funds planning grants to support resilience improvement plans for states and MPOs. It includes resilience planning, predesign and design activities, vulnerability assessments, and data tools to model transportation disruptions.
- No cost-match requirement
- Implementation: \$86M, \$100,000 min award
- Eligible Applicants: States, Local govts., MPOs, Tribal govt., Special purpose districts

PROTECT Program (Part B): Resilience Improvement Grants

- Funding Agency: U.S. DOT Funded by BIL
- FY24-26 Due February 24, 2025
- Supports enhancing existing surface transportation assets, strengthening their ability to withstand natural disasters and extreme weather, such as flooding, wildfires, and heat waves, and to adapt infrastructure to changing conditions like sea level rise.
- 20% cost-match requirement
- Implementation: \$618M, \$500,000 min award
- Eligible Applicants: States, Local govts., MPOs, Tribal govt., Special purpose districts





PROTECT Program (Part C): Community Resilience and Evacuation Route Grants

- Funding Agency: U.S. DOT Funded by BIL
- FY24-26 Due February 24, 2025
- Broad focus is to enhance and protect critical evacuation routes, ensuring safe passage during emergencies and reducing future risk of damage to these routes.
- 20% cost-match requirement
- Implementation: \$86M, \$500,000 min award
- Eligible Applicants: States, Local govts., MPOs, Tribal govt., Special purpose districts







Tribal Transportation Program Safety Fund (TTPSF)

- Funding Agency: U.S. DOT

 Funded by BIL
- FY25 Due January 15, 2025
- Broad focus is to reduce deaths and serious injuries in transportation-related crashes in tribal areas by supporting safety planning, data collection, and safety project implementation.
- No cost-match requirement
- Implementation: \$25,518,400
- Eligible Applicants: Tribal govts

Safe Streets for All (SS4A) Grant Program

- Funding Agency: U.S. DOT Funded by BIL
- FY25 will open LATE 2024/EARLY 2025
- Planning and Demonstration Grants safety action plans, supplemental safety planning, and/or safety demonstration activities.
- Implementation Grants for projects that are in existing roadway safety action plan.
- 20% cost-match requirement
- Implementation: \$1B+
 - \$100K (min) / \$25M (max)
- Eligible Applicants:
 - Cities, counties, MPOs, Tribal govt.


